Overview

The first ever 25hours Hotel in the Middle East opened its doors in December 2021, overlooking the stunning Museum of the Future and just a stone's throw away from Dubai International Financial Centre. Relaxed, fun and packed full of things to do, guests of 25hours Hotel One Central will experience ancient traditions of the Bedouins brought back to a modern life. Boasting 434 rooms and suites, 25hours Hotel One Central seamlessly blends nomadic yet contemporary design, masterminded by world renowned interior design firm, Woods Bagot. Unapparelled gastronomy and eclectic experiences making it the perfect playground for travellers and residents of the city to enjoy and revel in.

The urban tale starts in the lobby where one will be greeted by the Fountain of Tales, a colossal fountain with seating spaces and bookshelves featuring over 10,000 books. Adorning the top of the fountain is a rotating lit up globe showcasing artwork created by Marwan Shakarchi, known for his vibrant murals and cloud motifs. His unique creations symbolize hope and empowerment, adding a captivating visual element to the space and reflecting his artistic journey from small stickers to significant installations in Dubai's vibrant art scene. As guests scan upwards, they will find the ceiling taken over by a stunning piece of art — Under the Same Sky by Dominik Bulka — inspired by the constellations in the sky and interpreting them from a humorous, light-hearted point of view. They will be able to explore narratives that relate to Dubai and reference 25hours, its stories and ethos. Another popular feature in the lobby are the huge swinging chairs by Berlin based artist Muriel Gallardo Weinstein, inviting all those who pass for a swing. But that's not all, art lovers will also find a curated collection of artworks scattered across the property inspired by a modern interpretation of the rituals and traditions of the Dubai area and its people. As modern nomads, guests will be invited to discover the magic of the Bedouin and Hakawati heritage and take part of the narrative that shapes modern day Dubai.

Relaxation and wellness are not neglected either. On the sixth floor one will find the spacious wellness area with an indoor and outdoor gym inspired by the vibes of Venice Beach. The Extra Hour Spa, the pool on the roof terrace and Dubai's first outdoor mixed-used sauna provide the ideal moment of relaxation. With a fresh approach to spa, The Extra Hour is dedicated to 'you time' and everyone is welcome. Guests can indulge in a variety of treatments from quick (25 minute) fixes to full-body treatments. In addition, 25hours Hotel One Central offers a ladies' salon by renowned celebrity hairdresser Wassim Steve.

Those who would like to explore the local neighborhood and parklands by bike are also well catered for. Urban speedsters are available from the Berlin-based boutique bike maker Schindelhauer.

Last but not least, guests and locals alike can look forward to fresh culinary concepts. Nomad Day Bar, in partnership with Dubai-based Nightjar Coffee Roasters, Tandoor Tina for contemporary Indian fusion, and super popular Berlin rooftop bar, Monkey Bar complete the line-up together with ERNST — a traditional Bavarian biergarten and wirtshaus.



Interior & Story

25hours Hotel One Central boasts an unconventional mix of contemporary services, leaving everyone who walks through the doors with a story to tell. A fully kitted co-working space, meeting rooms, event spaces, open pantry and coffee bar are available at The Gallery on the first floor. The open plan space features plenty of modern tech, 5-meter-high ceilings and huge windows so guests can enjoy the breath-taking views while they work hard...or hardly work.

The hotel's "Analogue Upgrade" will give guests the opportunity to throwback and reminisce over simpler times.

Delivered in a large trunk-case to bedrooms, the unique experience includes VHS to vinyl, typewriters to Polaroids — encouraging to take a break from today's digital world and stimulate all senses. What's more, the "Analogue Circus" in partnership with Vienna based Supersense on the hotel's first floor houses over 500 vinyls and a Walkman station — the ideal break from a busy day co-working. Visitors can choose to listen to their favorite tunes the old-fashioned way or better yet, try their hand at burning their own vinyl disk. Other creative spaces include a trade in desk where guests can exchange their personal items for a night's stay, a pottery studio, games room and a podcast studio.

All rooms and suites at the property serve as a relaxing oasis for urban nomads after a long day exploring the city. Each sanctuary draws on local influences, featuring quirky design elements such as hammocks, double rainfall showers, roll-top baths, Schindelhauer bicycles, analogue telephones, Kreafunk Bluetooth speakers and much more. Room themes include Bedouin Room drawing on influences of when Bedouins once resided in Dubai, Glamping Room inspired by urban nomads and perfect for couples or special occasions, Farmstay Suite ideal for those looking for something super spacious and the Artist Village Suite which is an extra-large suite made for those looking to impress. The jewel in the crown is the Hakawati Suite. Featuring a unique Sheikh triple-king sized bed and eye-catching views of The Museum of The Future, the room also boasts a double bathtub, dancefloor, private bar, private terrace, photo booth and much more. It also interconnects with two additional bedrooms through a secret staircase.



Art & Design

The art at 25hours Hotel One Central is an integral part of the design, the story telling and the overall experience. Many artists have been involved in the process, which was led by London based art consultancy Double Decker. A big part of the artwork was commissioned exclusively for the hotel, like the lobby ceiling mural, the lobby wall vinyls, as well as most of the art on the second and third floor. This also includes the artwork in the Artist Village Suites.

Other pieces have been sourced out of the existing portfolio from renowned artists, but specially produced for 25hours Hotel One Central. This counts for the photographs on the gallery, fourth and fifth floor, as well as for the party camels in the Hakawati Suite. Most of the art was produced and commissioned via GMK Global, who specializes in the production of tailor-made art pieces for all kind of projects.

Even before entering the hotel, guests are taken on an adventure. Right in front of the entrance a previous race boat with side bars, the number 22, and the UAE flag on it awaits them. The journey of the Racing Boat for example reflects meticulous search and restoration, with an intriguing history tied to the Late Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid (brother to the Ruler of Dubai, H.H. Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum). It was found through the owner of a boat and marine transport factory, Mr Khattal, an Emirati man, and now decorates the entrance area.

When entering the hotel, guests will be welcomed by an impressive ceiling art. The Lobby Ceiling at 25hours Hotel One Central is a celestial masterpiece, inspired by the constellation of the stars and the rich history of Dubai. Designed to encapsulate the essence of the entire 25hours brand and the project, it intricately weaves references to all 25hours Hotels, key destinations, and partners. The celestial narrative is a visual journey connecting guests to the heart of Dubai, the United Arab Emirates, and the Bedouin heritage. Titled "Under the Same Sky" and crafted by Dominik Bulka, a Polish illustrator and artist, the ceiling invites guests to explore a universe where art and storytelling converge, creating a captivating ambiance that is both immersive and symbolic.

Aside from the ceiling art, the space showcases a striking globe installation by Marwan Shakarchi, celebrated for his vibrant cloud motifs. The rotating globe atop the fountain not only serves as a focal point but also reflects his themes of hope and empowerment, inviting viewers to connect with the emotions and stories behind each cloud he has painted. His dynamic artwork enhances the visual landscape, transforming the globe into a captivating symbol of his artistic journey.

There are also three huge hanging chairs made out of various colourful textile materials and techniques by the Chilean artist Muriel Gallardo Weinstein are a real eye-catcher in the lobby. They not only invite guests to take a seat, but rather to go on a sensory experience where one sheltered in a refuge reflects on the common origin of the journey of life. Each chair thereby represents the different inhabitants of Dubai: natives, foreigners and immigrants. The aim of the project is to "evolve and represent different populations around the world" as the artist states.

The dioramas in the elevators made by Hamburg artist Sandra Havemeister transport viewers to imaginative worlds. Named Desert Night, Wonders, Desert Jungle, Under construction, Storytelling, and Old and New Dubai, they are each intricately crafted with miniature figures, light, photos, and perspectives.



Floor by floor, the art narrative develops. The first floor of 25hours Hotel One Central unfolds a rich tapestry of artistic expressions featuring the works of Jalal Abuthina and Tulip Hazbar. Abuthina, a Dubai resident of Irish and Libyan heritage, is a multifaceted creator, photographer, writer, and publisher. His 3-set series, "Inside Dubai", serves as an alternative narrative, delving into the city's older districts over a decade. Complementing Abuthina's storytelling, Tulip Hazbar, a UAE-based artist and designer, brings a unique perspective through illustrations, found objects, and installations, exploring the themes of memory and collecting. The collaboration "Jalal x doc" unveils the Analog Circus, capturing the essence of Shadi Megallaa, owner of The Flip Side. Digital transformations by Florian Kaps of Supersense result in final artworks, enriching the floor's narrative. The Flip Side, renowned as the only independent record shop in the United Arab Emirates, adds a musical dimension to the space, embodying a pioneering spirit within Dubai's vibrant music scene, situated in the cultural hub of Alserkal Avenue in Al Quoz.

The second and third floors transport guests into the captivating world of "Ancient Nomads - From the Sea to the Desert". These floors vividly represent Dubai's Bedouin past, where nomads traversed the desert, and pearl diving thrived as the primary income along the coast. Imbued with the essence of sandy deserts, the floors feature beige carpets and a rich tapestry of tribal artwork, showcasing the Bedouin lifestyle with abundant camels and oases. Tulip Hazbar contributes to this narrative with her profound work.

On the fourth and fifth floors the narrative of "Advanced Nomads – From the Desert to the City" is told, illustrating the transformative journey of the UAE from its founding in 1971 to the present, marked by iconic landmarks like Burj Khalifa. Through the lens of Jalal Abuthina, these floors encapsulate the metamorphosis of the city. His photographs capture areas that have undergone significant changes, as they were transformed from once-existing landscapes to the vibrant developments of Downtown, City Walk, and La Mer.

The seventh and eight floors propel guests into the future with the theme "Modern Nomads – From the City to the Moon". Paying homage to the UAE's aspirations of becoming a space nation, these floors are a fusion of futuristic design and a nod to traditional elements like nomads, camels, and the desert. Aligned in spirit and design with the Museum of the Future, the artworks on these floors revolve around astronauts, space, and the future. Artworks include those of Shahad Nazer, a Saudi Egyptian artist, renowned for her digital pieces that weave stunning visual universes and those of Ze Otavio, hailing from Olímpia-SP and having lived in London and São Paulo. He is a proof to the tradition that the biggest gift an artist can have is his eyes. He roams freely through themes and techniques. Colourful, chaotic, defiant, sexy, androgynous, provocative.



Cinema Akil

Cinema Akil, a name synonymous with cinematic disruption and creativity, and the only independent arthouse in the Gulf Cooperation Council, opened its seasonal outdoor outpost Cinema Akil at 25hours Hotel One Central in November 2023 in its latest collaboration with Ennismore.

Located within the vibrant 25hours Hotel, Cinema Akil is spanning across an impressive 1,867.5 square feet and offers a multi-faceted space divided into three distinct sections: the box office/concession area, the open cinema theatre, and a multipurpose retail and pop-up space. Beyond screening films, it promises an electric array of entertainment options, including a food & beverage offer, music events, talks, and pop-up experiences. Designed for film screenings and a multitude of other activities, the cinema boasts a theatre with a seating capacity of 72 people and a total standing capacity of approximately 150 guests across all three zones, creating an intimate yet vibrant atmosphere for cinema enthusiasts and creatives alike. With versatility in mind, it also offers a unique space to accommodate takeovers, venue rentals, and collaborations. The flexible environment can seamlessly adapt to different needs, fostering a creative atmosphere for a variety of purposes.

Entirely complimentary with a prior booking, Cinema Akil at 25hours Hotel One Central will host screenings four times a week on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays, and Sundays, with films typically commencing between 7.30 pm and 8 pm. Each season, with the first taking place from November 2023 to May 2024, will bring a fresh, diverse, and carefully curated programme each month. The entire venue will be open daily from 12 pm until 10 pm allowing guests to experience the versatility of the space through installations, social interaction and retail, while enjoying a curated food & beverage menu.

"Cinema Akil's integration into 25hours Hotel One Central has been a journey of creativity and collaboration. We believe this new venue will resonate deeply with Dubai's dynamic and ever-evolving cultural landscape. Tandoor Tina

Tandoor Tina celebrates fresh, high-quality ingredients, bold, bright flavors and specializes in cooking over fire on the grill and tandoor oven. Inspired by a journey through India, the restaurant revives the smells, tastes and colors of exotic and carefree travels — with a year-round summer mood. Featuring interiors in Jaipur pastel pink hues, wicker lights, and luscious botanicals, the restaurant also offers a terrace, a secluded tropical garden with ample seating, and an al fresco kitchen.

From entering the space, the colors and smells immediately transport the diner to another place and time. The restaurant is centered around the hero of the kitchen, the Tandoor oven, an ancient cooking tool prevalent across India and the Middle East. Aiming to revive the experience of traveling with exotic scenes and a relaxing holiday mood, Tandoor Tina is about stepping out of your day and taking a break with wholesome food and warm hospitality. The restaurant buzzes daily with friends and colleagues sharing charred breads, fragrant dips, and refreshing mocktails. In the evening, plates of grilled vegetables, fish, and meat are followed by brightly garnished Gin & Tonics and ended with a heaped spoonful of dark chocolate and coconut mousse.

Focusing on the humble tradition of cooking with fire and elevating ingredients with Indian-influenced flavors, Tandoor Tina champions vegetables, local fish, seafood, and carefully marinated meats. The menu offers fresh, comforting, and wholesome dishes from lunch to dinner. Plating and service are generous, colorful, and reflective of a holiday-dining mood. With a menu designed for sharing, guests will find options that range from light and healthy to hearty and decadent, providing plates for all occasions and appetites.

To celebrate the ultimate quick business lunch, Tandoor Tina offers Tina's Express Lunch served thali-style, with a choice of starters, mains, and desserts that change monthly. Inspired by slow travels by rail through Northern India, the Afternoon Tea is a feast for the eyes, available Monday to Friday from 3 pm to 6 pm. Every Tuesday, Tina's Tacos invites guests to experience a menu of unique fusion flavors in a relaxed and stylish setting.

To accommodate various types of events, from Thali celebrations to intimate dinners, the restaurant offers a private dining room known as the "Luggage Room". This exclusive space provides a cozy and elegant setting for gatherings, with the added bonus of impressive views overlooking the Museum of the Future. Whether for a special occasion or a corporate gathering, the Luggage Room can comfortably accommodate up to 12 guests, ensuring a personalized and intimate experience for all attendees.



ERNST Biergarten & Wirtshaus

ERNST is a Bavarian biergarten and wirtshaus serving a variety of German beers on draught, Dubai's best Weisswein, and house-baked pretzels. The wirtshaus has a total of 420 seats. 190 of these are located in the outdoor area — the beer garden — with a unique view of the Burj Khalifa. The picturesquely designed and spacious restaurant offers all the elements of a country wirtshaus as found in Bavaria — a rustic interior, the best beer and honest food that can be enjoyed in a lively and welcoming atmosphere where no visitor ever feels alone. As in Bavaria, the interior consists of a Schwemme, i.e., the vaulted area next to the bar, a parlour at the back of the restaurant and an indoor beer garden. This has a 30 metre long, horizontally suspended maypole with individually designed illustrations of the Bavarian and Munich "way of life". The interior design is characterised by typical elements such as hearts in the backrests of the furniture, the materials used such as wrought iron, copper and wood, e.g., for the wall panelling and genuine Bavarian antiques such as flails, wagon wheels and other agricultural equipment, countless historic beer mugs as well as sports equipment and household goods. The planted outdoor beer garden features a Bavarian mussel fountain and its own curling lane. ERNST brings Bavarian cosiness and conviviality to the city centre of Dubai.

The concept of the restaurant primarily serves to cultivate the Bavarian beer tradition. Guests can see this as soon as they enter the restaurant, where 30,000 original Paulaner crown corks have been repurposed as flooring. But also in the art in the entire taproom, as this comes largely from the archives of Munich breweries and includes, for example, historical labels, Oktoberfest and traditional costume pictures. Guests can choose from various types of draught beer, including Paulaner. Regulars can purchase their personalised beer mugs, which are stored in 126 lockers for the next visit.

Serving an honest and simple cuisine from Bavaria with pork knuckle, sausages and home-baked pretzels on the menu, ERNST promises a thoroughly German experience for everyone. All specialities are produced on site. These are classics, but not outdated, timeless recipes that have stood the test of time. The dishes are presented in a convivial setting — boards, pots and pans are used so that guests can share and really eat together — just like at grandma's table.

The restaurant hosts regular live entertainment, quiz nights and seasonal events. Also live matches are shown from around the world across multiple screens. A private dining room for up to 20 people, the "Schickeria-Kammerl", which is decorated with portraits of famous Munich citizens, can be hired for Bavarian banquets.

ERNST brings Bavarian culinary culture to the heart of Dubai — no frills, just authenticity. The beer garden is intended to be a place where every guest feels part of a close-knit community and leaves with a full heart (and stomach!) — a very special place, the likes of which do not yet exist in Dubai.



Monkey Bar

Monkey Bar, a Berlin import, has made its mark as one of Dubai's most thrilling cocktail destinations. On the first floor, visitors can access a fully equipped co-working space with an adjacent coffee bar.
